Regrets: I write to sadly share that I will not be able to attend the Potter Club hoe down as I will be in Kenya trying to help train and create Kenya's first ever national U-22 lacrosse team for the World games next summer in Limerick, Ireland. Since college, and our rather colorful four years together, I kind of have divided my time between academics and lacrosse in a pretty even measure. I had an extensive educational career in Oceanside in social studies education and administration, complimented by the privilege of coaching lacrosse on nearly every level from Division I to five-year old tyros to professional. While working as Oceanside's social studies director, I had the great opportunity to coach lacrosse at Adelphi for decades in a number of capacities and we have enjoyed a good deal of success. After Oceanside and Adelphi, I received my doctorate on hope and grit from Hofstra and taught education courses at Molloy College for fifteen years, and in that tenure, I was privileged to not only watch my sons play lacrosse at Springfield College, but to coach the national teams of Australia, Spain and now, Kenya.

I write you to now because the Kenyan team that I coach is largely made up of orphans living in unfathomable poverty, people whose only meal is the meal we provide at training camp. This is no joke as I am there at the writing of this letter, The game introduces hope, and, in their lives, it is far more than just a game. It is the only thing that they have. I have been connected with Kenya and Uganda since 2016 and it is our dream to take a first ever African team to next summer's world championships. Of course, what I am now asking for is your financial help in providing the funding for these young men to get to Ireland next August, and also to hold and participate in the training camps to get them ready. Since the game is new to the country, as it was to many of you at SUNY in 67 on our first club team, training is vital (Some of the 71 first ever SUNYA lacrosse alums are theoretically planning to attend in Ireland, God willing as my mother used to say!).
